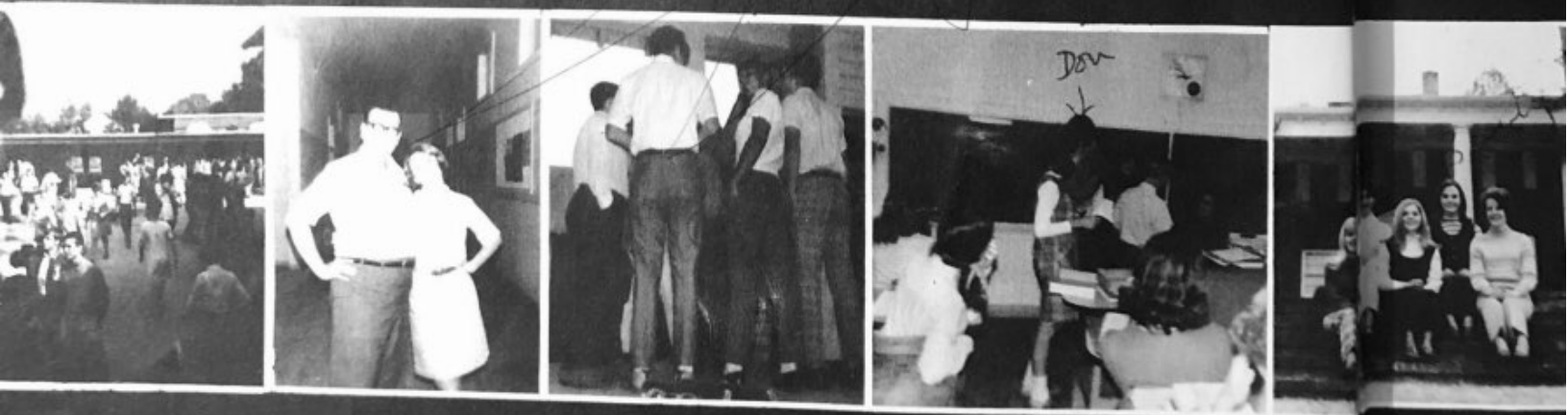


The 1970 Mastiff Staff wishes to pay tribute to a man who has endeared himself to all segments of Lyons High School.
